The door hangers on the following pages are designed to help us all work together to improve our water conservation. If you've noticed a friend or neighbor who has particularly nice water-saving landscaping, or maybe one who has a leaking fixture, you can let them know in a friendly way with one of these handy door hangers.



Door hanger #1 can be used to say “I’m impressed” when a friend or neighbor is doing a great job conserving.

Door hanger #2 can be used to say “I noticed something wrong” like a broken sprinkler that your neighbor may not be aware of.

Print only page 3 of this document.

Print, fold, and cut to make a door hanger.

1. Print the door hanger you wish to use.
2. Fold the paper lengthways with the printed sides facing out.
3. With the paper folded, cut a vertical slit along the white line above the “Act Now Save Water” circle.
4. Cut out the white circle completely. Write your message in the space provided.

Did you know that much of our water comes from special places like Mono Lake, the Sierra Nevada, and the Colorado River?

Did you know that over 50% of residential water use is for outdoor landscaping?

You can help protect our environment and save money now with these ten outdoor water conservation tips:

1. Irrigate landscapes only in early morning hours and reduce irrigation cycles by 1–3 minutes.
2. Adjust sprinklers to avoid unnecessary overspray or runoff.
3. Fix leaky and broken sprinkler heads.
4. Replace spray heads with water-efficient rotator nozzles.
5. Use drips or bubblers to irrigate flower beds and shrubs.
6. Use an irrigation controller with a rain “shutoff” sensor.
7. Adjust your irrigation timer to use the right amount of water for the season.
8. Put mulch 2–4 inches deep around trees, bushes, and shrubs to reduce evaporation.
9. Replace all or part of your lawn with low water use plants.
10. Call your Water Department for rebates and additional water conservation tips.
